Guest Artists

Lindsey Donnell is an artist with the internationally renowned Dance Theatre of Harlem (DTH). A native of Midland, Texas, she trained under Susan Clark and the late Judy Coleman. After attending Butler University where she earned degrees in Dance-Arts Administration and Journalism, she began her professional career with Nashville Ballet. She moved to NYC to join DTH for its celebrated return and inaugural year under Virginia Johnson. With DTH she performed at the White House, in almost all 50 states and in Italy, Honduras, Israel, Turkey, Poland and Brazil. Witnessing the power of art to unite communities led Lindsey to speak at TEDxBroadway 2016 and she was a featured artist at the opening of One World Trade Center. Lindsey's performance highlights include the 2017 and 2022 Kennedy Center Honors, Jacobs Pillow, Veil Dance Festival, and the Kennedy Center's Ballet Across America. She has danced works by George Balanchine, William Forsythe, Nacho Duato, Alvin Ailey, Robert Garland, Geoffrey Holder, Dianne McIntyre, Stanton Welch and Annabelle Lopez-Ochoa.

Elias Re was born in Milan, Italy. He trained at La Scala Ballet School, Sarasota Cuban Ballet School and Escuela Nacional de Ballet de Cuba. His professional experience includes Dance Theatre of Harlem (second season), American Repertory Ballet, New Jersey Ballet, Cleveland Ballet and RP Civic Ballet Training Company. His repertoire includes works by George Balanchine, Jerome Robbins, Christopher Wheeldon, Geoffrey Holder, Stanton Welch, Robert Garland, Claire Davidson, Anna Rita Larghi, Gino Labate, Victor Alexander, and DTH Alumni Da'Von Doane.

Marlon Grigsby began his training with Dancers' Workshop and now teaches and dances in the Houston area with companies including City Ballet of Houston, Juxtapose Dance Arts, Opera in the Heights and Uptown Dance. He returns often to guest with BRBT, recently in *Cinderella* and as the prince in *Rapunzel*. A graduate of LSU, he performed and choreographed for the LSU Dance Ensemble, appeared in *Racine D'or*, and toured in performances to New York City and Boston.

He uses dance as a means to bring communities together through social events, benefits, community art initiatives and liturgical ministries. You will find Leonard enjoying his retirement from a career in civil service through his world travels. He also is a member of BRBT's Ballet for Every Body and tours as the Wolf in *Peter and the Wolf* to area schools.

A former BRBT Company member, she has performed with our Youth Ballet and in this production as a Party Girl, Bonbon, Angel, Soldier, Snowflake and Party Mom. Sarah also serves as a BRBT Board Member.

Jennifer Perone MD MS is a board-certified surgical oncologist at Ochsner- MD Anderson Cancer Center in Baton Rouge. She received her B.A. in Psychology and Theology from Boston College and her medical degree from Ohio State University. She then completed her general surgery residency and a master's in clinical sciences at UTMB in Galveston, TX, followed by a fellowship in surgical oncology at Moffitt Cancer Center in Tampa, FL. She and her husband, Warren Mertz, returned home to Baton Rouge in 2023. Directors and Production Staff

Rebecca Mathews Acosta (Artistic Director) is director of dance at Baton Rouge Magnet High School where she also choreographs for the theater department and orchestra productions. She is the director of the BRBT Youth Ballet and teaches intermediate and advanced ballet at The Dancers' Workshop. An LSU graduate, she also earned a nursing degree from our Lady of the Lake College. She has appeared in numerous principal roles with BRBT including Azalea Fairy in *The Nutcracker*, the Fairy Godmother in *Cinderella*, the Lilac Fairy in *Sleeping Beauty*, Myrtha in *Giselle*, the Mother in "Family Secrets" and Mother in "Women of Acts". Rebecca studied on full scholarship at the Joffrey Ballet, New York, and on scholarship with the Eglevsky Ballet, where she appeared as a demi-soloist in Swan Lake and a soloist in *Paquita*. She also appeared in several LSU opera and theater productions and in *West Side Story* with Theatre Baton Rouge.
