She has trained at intensives nationwide including DanceWorks Chicago, University of the Arts, Broadway Dance Center, Steps on Broadway, Peridance Center, Brenau University, Dallas Ballet Company, The Washington Ballet, and Nashville Ballet. She is a proud member of Mélange Dance Company and a dance instructor at the Louisiana Academy of Performing Arts. Adrienne holds bachelor's degrees in business management and theatre and is pursuing her master's in business administration at UNO. Adrienne focuses on work with inclusive representation for diverse audiences in hopes of widening perspectives.

Guest Choreographers

Shannon J. Grayson is a native of Baton Rouge, LA and current Assistant Professor of Practice at the USC Glorya Kaufman of Dance. She graduated from Howard University with a BFA in Dance Arts and received summer intensive scholarships to Debbie Allen Dance Academy, Ronald K. Brown/Evidence and Dallas Black Dance Theatre. She continued her training with scholarships to Jacob's Pillow Jazz/Musical Theatre Program, Jacob's Pillow Choreographers Lab and Nathan Trice Summer Dance Intensive. She relocated to Chicago as a Lou Conte Dance Studio (LCDS) scholarship student under the direction of Claire Bataille, and performed with Muntu Dance Theatre and Winifred Haun & Dancers and was a featured dancer in the Bollywood movie Dhoom 3. Her Chicago training experiences furthered her development artistically as a dancer, dance educator, teacher, choreographer and eventually led to a full time teaching position for Hubbard Street Dance Chicago (HSDC) with the LCDS, HSDC Youth Dance Program, HSDC Education & Community Programs and HSCD Professional Pilot Program. She has been an adjunct faculty member at Columbia College Chicago and Dominican University, River Forest, IL and has taught for Joffrey Chicago Professional Summer Dance Intensive. Grayson is a certified Horton Technique instructor through the Ailey School, NASM Certified Personal Trainer and Nutrition Coach. She has choreographed for USC Dramatic School of Arts, Chicago Freelance Dance Project, Columbia College Chicago and DanceWorks Chicago DanceChance. She continues to train and teach extensively in various techniques including Hip Hop, Jazz, Tap, Modern, Contemporary, Ballet, African, Afro Cuban and Dunham Technique.

Joan Rodriguez is a Cuban-born dancer, choreographer, and educator known for his dynamic versatility, seamlessly blending Afro-Latin, contemporary, and multimedia styles. He graduated from the prestigious Escuela Nacional de Arte, earning the "Best Graduate of the Year" award, and began his career with DanzAbierta and Malpaso Dance Company. In 2016, after relocating to the United States as a political refugee, Joan moved to Arizona, where he focused on creating,

teaching, and producing multimedia projects in collaboration with museums and as Guest Faculty for Arizona State University. His journey continued in New York with Parsons Dance, where he choreographed an original work for the 2018 GenerationNow fellowship. He later created an original work for Connecticut Ballet, while serving as Guest Artist in Residence at various universities and arts centers across the U.S. Joan plays a pivotal role at BODYTRAFFIC as the master teacher in education and outreach, Social Media Manager, and lead content creator. His acclaimed commissioned work, Bloquea'o, has toured the U.S., and he is now preparing for a second commission. Joan's passion lies in building community through dance, sharing movement across diverse settings, and pioneering innovative intersections between performance and media. This is Joan's fourth season dancing with BODYTRAFFIC, and his first season as Rehearsal Director.

Directors and Production Staff

She is the director of the BRBT Youth Ballet and teaches intermediate and advanced ballet at The Dancers' Workshop. An LSU graduate, she also earned a nursing degree from our Lady of the Lake College. She has appeared in numerous principal roles with BRBT including Azalea Fairy in *The Nutcracker*, the Fairy Godmother in *Cinderella*, the Lilac Fairy in *Sleeping Beauty*, Myrtha in *Giselle*, the Mother in "Family Secrets" and Mother in "Women of Acts". Rebecca studied on full scholarship at the Joffrey Ballet, New York, and on scholarship with the Eglevsky Ballet, where she appeared as a demi-soloist in Swan Lake and a soloist in *Paquita*.
