GUEST ARTISTS

Emelia Perkins began her training at The Dancers' Workshop when she was only four-years-old. Later, as a company member of BRBT, she performed many roles in *The Nutcracker* as well as works of choreography by many local and guest artists, inspiring her to become a professional ballet dancer. She left Baton Rouge to pursue more intensive training with Houston Ballet Academy, where she spent the last two years of her dance education. Upon graduating at the highest level of their academy, Emelia joined Kansas City Ballet as a trainee in their second company.

In 2018, Emelia joined the studio company of Sarasota Ballet and was later promoted through the ranks to Corphée. With Sarasota Ballet, Emelia performed works with choreography by Sir Frederick Aston, George Balanchine, Mark Morris, Twyla Tharp, Sir Peter Wright and Martha Graham, Paul Taylor, and Dominic Walsh.

This season, Emelia moved to the Denver area to work as a freelance artist, securing contracts with several organizations. This freedom has finally allowed her to return home to perform with Baton Rouge Ballet Theatre in leading roles for two full-length ballets; as Sugar Plum Fairy in The Nutcracker - A Tale from the Bayou and in the titular role of Rapunzel in the spring of 2026.

Sanford Placide was born in Port-au-Prince, Haiti, Sanford Placide and grew up in Gonaïves, where he began learning Afro- Caribbean and folkloric dance at 11. After emigrating to the U.S., he trained with Ballet Etudes of South Florida, Francois Perron at Manhattan Youth Ballet, the French Academie of Ballet in NYC, and privately with Nadege Hottier. He also attended prestigious summer intensives across the country.

Placide's professional career spans six seasons with Dance Theatre of Harlem (DTH), following engagements with Alberta Ballet, Ballet West 2, and North Carolina Dance Theatre 2 (now Charlotte Ballet). He has performed as a guest artist with multiple companies including Ballet Etudes of South Florida, Voorhees Ballet, and Collage Dance Collective.

His repertoire includes works by George Balanchine, William Forsythe, Nacho Duato, Stanton Welch, Glenn Tetley, Annabelle Lopez Ochoa, Wen Wei Wang, Robert Garland, Mark Diamond, Desmond Richardson, Yukicchi Hattori, Aszure Barton. Tiffany Rae Fischer, and Claudia Schreier.

With his dynamic artistry and technical precision, Placide continues to captivate audiences worldwide, contributing to the evolution and enrichment of the dance world.

Devin Jordan is a junior at UL-Lafayette majoring in Performing Arts with a connection in Dance. He is a TOPS and Live Oak Scholarship recipient as well as a member of Chi Tau Epsilon. He studied and completed at Dance Graphics and currently teaches there. Most recently, Devin performed in *Ten Tiny Dances*© and ULL Spring and Fall dance productions.

Marlon Grigsby began his training with Dancers' Workshop and now teaches and dances in the Houston area with companies including City Ballet of Houston, Juxtapose Dance Arts, Opera in the Heights and Uptown Dance. He returns often to guest with BRBT, recently in *Cinderella* and as the prince in *Rapunzel*. A graduate of LSU, he performed and choreographed for the LSU Dance Ensemble, appeared in *Racine D'or*; and toured in performances to New York City and Boston.
